

Over 100 years ago the founder of the Missionary Servants of the Most Holy Trinity, Fr. Thomas Augustine Judge, had a vision. Instead, he set out with a vision to preserve the faith by making every Catholic a missionary.

TRINITY MISSIONS TODAY

What began with the commitment of Fr. Judge to serve the destitute and abandoned in urban and rural centers in the U.S. has now expanded into many ministries seeking out and serving the poorest people in our own country and in Latin America.

With your help, Trinity Missions provides Mission Medical Clinics in five countries, we help those suffering with addiction, we educate impoverished youth for a better future, we provide guidance for migrants, we offer hope through the sacraments, we feed and clothe the most vulnerable, we provide clean water, and we empower women by teaching entrepreneurial skills to help them gain independence.

Providing for Undocumented Workers in Coachella & Mecca, CA

Trinity Missions provides spiritual care as well as practical support such as shelter, clothing, and food, to large Catholic communities made up mostly of farm workers, including both seasonal and undocumented workers. Homeland Security frequently releases migrants who have recently crossed the border at our mission churches in these communities to care for children and families who have no one else to help.

It's heartbreaking to hear about the many individuals who cross the desert in search of safety and support, yet Trinity Missions shines as a beacon of hope for this vulnerable population. Because the ancestral lands of the Native American community we serve straddles the United States into Mexico, there is much traveling between the two countries. Trinity Missions ministers to individuals who have crossed the desert seeking shelter, food, clothing and transportation to family members in other parts of the country.





Assisting Displaced Migrants in Carthage, MS

Many Guatemalan families still suffer from the traumatic effects of the ICE raids in this community several years ago. Events like these have long-lasting effects, particularly when it comes to trauma and mental health. Trinity Missions offers food, rental assistance, trauma counseling, and other forms of support which are crucial in helping people cope with this kind of dislocation, as well as assisting individuals with immigration status.

LOCAL IMPACT

In the greater Washington, DC area, Trinity Missions recently opted to lease a large building owned by the community to serve the mental health needs of the many migrants and Spanish speakers in the metro area. There is great trauma among the migrant population from their journeys that often included family separation, rape, and other violent acts. Trinity Missions opted for this lease rather than offering the property for development of high-income housing, believing this decision would help the community by addressing the pressing needs of local migrants.

The Missionary Servants also offer priests and a Brother who provide outreach to migrant families. Charitable funds for basic needs such as rent, food, and medical care are distributed to those who are vulnerable and in need. Additionally, our priests extend spiritual care and counseling in an area which is greatly underserved.
